Betty Louise "Lou" Bollan, 77, of Huntington, passed away peacefully surrounded by family on March 14, 2017 at Parkview Huntington Hospital. Known by some as Babblin Brook, Lou has joined her late husband, Don Bollan, known by some as Deep River, "in that yonder city, that's not made by hands."

with her playing skills. It was common place to see a little one perched beside her, learning from the master.
