November 16, 1911 - June 3, 2009

Beulah I. "Babe" Votrie, age 97, Huntington, died at 1:50 p.m. Wednesday (June 3, 2009).

She was born on November 16, 1911 in Goblesville, Indiana, the daughter of Lyman and Bertha (Howenstine) Myers. Beulah married Kenneth L. Votrie on March 6, 1937 in Roanoke. He preceded her in death on September 11, 1985. Beulah was a 1929 graduate of Clear Creek High School. She retired as an operator from Indiana Bell Telephone Company in 1975 after 27 years of service. Beulah worked with her husband on their Huntington Township farm. She was a 50 year plus member of The Order of Eastern Star Floral Chapter #75 of Huntington where she served as a Martha Point and Electa Point. She belonged to the Telephone Pioneers; Evangelical United Methodist Church of Huntington, she taught Sunday school for seven years; the Wally Byam Caravan Club, Ft. Wayne Unit; and a member of the Huntington County Extension Women's Choir that sang in Washington, D.C. in 1948.

Survivors include two daughters – Nancy (Dennis) Michnal of Huntington and Barbara (Raymond) Bendure of Three Rivers, Michigan; three grandchildren – Richard (Natalie) Bendure of Aurora, IL, Ronald (Karyn) Bendure of Maineville, OH, and Laurie (Jason) Peck of Van Nuys, CA; four great-grandchildren – Riley & Royce Bendure of Aurora, IL and Rhett & Ristin Bendure of Maineville, OH. She is preceded in death by her parents, husband, and two brothers – Hildreth Myers and Clarence Ivern Myers.
