



Burl E. Pease

November 15, 1922 - October 12, 2014

Burl E. Pease, age 91, of Roanoke, died at 8:45 p.m. Sunday (October 12, 2014) at his home.

Visitation will be held from 3 p.m. - 7 p.m. Wednesday (October 15, 2014) at Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington. Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Thursday (October 16, 2014) at Bailey-Love Mortuary with Rev. Eugene Vickery officiating. There will be one hour of visitation prior to the funeral service. Burial will be in Glenwood Cemetery in Roanoke with military graveside rites performed by VFW Post #2689 of Huntington.

Preferred memorials are to Huntington Church of the Nazarene, in care of Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington, IN.

Burl was born November 15, 1922 in Buchanan, Michigan, the son of Godfrey and Phenie (Goss) Pease. Burl served in the United States Army in the Office of Strategic Services during WWII. He married Clara L. Fausz on April 20, 1946 in Markle. Burl worked on his Jackson Township farm. He worked as a foreman at Majestic in Huntington for 24 years. He retired after 17 years as a foreman at Fox Products in South Whitley, where he made musical instruments. Burl was a member of Huntington Church of the Nazarene, Gideon International, and Farm Bureau. He was a member of American Legion Post #160 in Roanoke and a life member of the China-Burma-India

Veterans Association. Burl loved traveling with his wife, camping, and woodworking. He also loved to visit vintage airshows, where he could see and ride in planes similar to those he flew in during his time in the war.

Burl is survived by his wife of 68 years - Clara L. Pease of Roanoke; one sister - Charlotte Will of Buchanan; a nephew - Randy Pease of Roanoke; a niece - Ila Mae (Dale) Drenchkahn of Elko, Minnesota; two-sisters-in-law - Ruth Turner of Buchanan, Michigan and Londa Fausz of Huntington; and numerous nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by his parents, eight brothers - Clayton Pease, Leonard Pease, Denver Pease, Clarence Pease, Sydney Pease, Delorne Pease, Ollie Breland, and Thad Breland; four sisters - Audrey Diamond, Zaphine Zabel, Helen Tucker, and Ethel Smith.

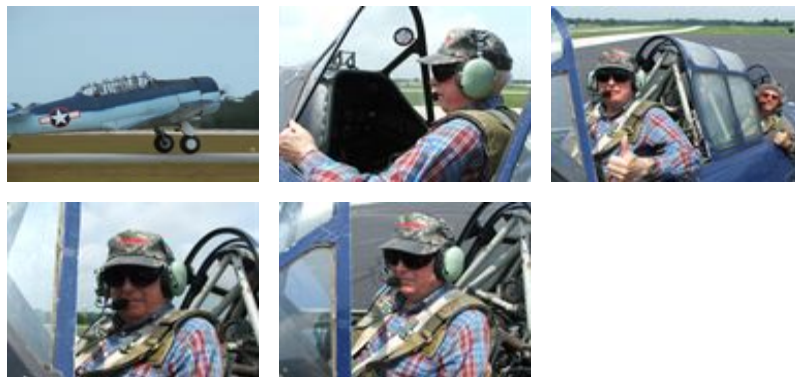
