Carole June Baker, 79, of Huntington, passed away at 10:10 pm Friday, October 28, 2022 at her son's residence in Ft. Wayne, IN.

Carole was born on November 6, 1942 in Huntington, IN, the daughter of Harry Hartle and Roberta (Young) Hartle. She graduated from Huntington Township High School, earned her Bachelor's Degree from Manchester College (now named Manchester University, and she earned her Master's Degree from Purdue University.
