



Carolyn J. (Sunderman) Hart

Carolyn June (Sunderman) Hart, age 79, of Huntington, died at 10:55 a.m. Thursday (April 7, 2011) at Heritage Pointe, Warren.

Carolyn was born on June 26, 1931, in Huntington County, the daughter of Fred and Marie (Shideler) Sunderman. She graduated from Lancaster High School in 1949, and went on to attend the Fort Wayne Beauty College. On October 26, 1951, she married Robert Layton Hart in Huntington County and he survives.

After 40 years of business, Carolyn retired in 1997 as an owner and operator of the Hart Motel in Fort Wayne along with her husband, Robert Hart. After retirement, they loved living in the home they built on her family homestead. She was a member of the Loon Creek Church of the Brethren. Carolyn loved her family, gardening, wildlife, and helping other people.

Survivors include her husband of 60 years - Robert Hart of Huntington; one son - Greg Hart (Pat) of Fort Wayne; two daughters - Pamela Sue Hart Butts (James) of Warsaw, and Valerie Hart Tinay (John) of Grand Rapids, Michigan; two brothers - Don Sunderman (Eleanor) of Huntington, and John Sunderman (Marilyn) of Huntington; two sisters - Dianne Parrett (Dave) of Huntington; Pat Weeks (John) of Fishers; one sister-in-law - Marilyn Randol of Huntington; six grandchildren; and four great grandchildren.
