April 5, 1944 - June 14, 2009

Christian C. Holst, age 65, of Huntington, died at 8:53 a.m. Sunday (June 14, 2009) at the Burn and Wound Center, St. Joseph Hospital, Fort Wayne.

Christian was born on April 5, 1944 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to Paul Frederick Georg Holst and Adda Elena Eleanora (Moller) Holst, both natives of Denmark. He graduated from Syosset High School, Long Island, New York in 1962 and earned a BS in electrical engineering at Indiana Institute of Technology, Fort Wayne. Christian married C. Kathryn (Kathy) Shelton on May 31, 1975 in Rupert, Idaho. He was employed by CTS of Berne from 1967-1982 and within that time directed the engineering set-up of CTS Singapore. He was the plant manager of Dwyer Instruments in South Whitley, IN from 1982-1985 and the chief engineer of Goshen Rubber from 1985-1998. He was active in Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity, Berne Jaycees, and a member of Grace Lutheran Church, Columbia City.

Survivors include his wife of 34 years – C. Kathryn (Kathy) Shelton Holst of Huntington; one daughter – Cassandra C. (Jeremy) Truelove of South Whitley, Indiana. His parents precede him in death.
