Clyde D. Winkler, age 90, of Huntington, passed away at 2:45 a.m. Tuesday (February 4, 2014) at Oakbrook Village in Huntington.

There will be no visitation or funeral services. Burial will be held at a later date.

Clyde was born on February 13, 1923 in Huntington County, son of Horace and Sarah (Schultz) Winkler. He graduated from Huntington High School in 1943. He served in the U.S. Army during WWII.
