Donald W. Dreyer, age 89, of Huntington, died at 4:09 p.m. Monday (April 13, 2015) at Parkview Huntington Hospital.

Visitation will be held from 12 p.m. - 1 p.m. Friday (April 17, 2015) at Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington, Indiana. Funeral services will immediately follow at 1 p.m. Friday with Pastor Chris Stahlman and Rev. Bruce Wrightsman officiating. Burial will be in Fairview Cemetery in Servia, Indiana.

Don was born on July 23, 1925 in Council Bluffs, Iowa, the son of W.F. and Lucille (Evans) Dreyer. He graduated from Faragut High School in Faragut, Iowa in 1942 and served in the United States Air Force. He married Wanda Morford on August 9, 1946 in Omaha, Nebraska. Don founded Huntington Asphalt and owned the business for 20 years; he also farmed in Warren Township. He attended South Whitley United Methodist Church and was a collector of toy tractors. He was a fan of the Indianapolis Colts and enjoyed fishing.

Survivors include his wife of 67 years - Wanda L. Dreyer of Huntington; daughter - Gail L. (Carroll) Kelley of McCordsville, Indiana; son - Steve D. (Roberta) Dreyer of Fort Wayne; son-in-law - Ron Sharpe of Huntington; sister - Ann (Jim) O'Hara of Shenandoah, Iowa; two brothers - Fred Dreyer and Bill

(Shirley) Dreyer, both of Shenandoah, Iowa; eight grandchildren, fifteen great grandsons, and two great granddaughters. He is preceded in death by his parents, two daughters - Susan Sharpe and Linda Sue Dreyer, and sister - Carol Matthews.
