Frederick E. "Cowboy Fred" Kintz, age 64, died at 7:30 p.m. Thursday (February 14, 2013) at his home in Huntington, Indiana.

Family will receive friends 10 a.m. - 11 a.m. Tuesday (February 19, 2013) at Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington, Indiana. A Mass of Christian Burial will follow at 11:00 a.m. Tuesday (February 19, 2013) at St. Mary's Catholic Church, 903 N. Jefferson, Huntington, Indiana, with Father John Pfister officiating. Burial will be at 1:00 p.m. in the Catholic Cemetery, 3500 Lake Avenue, Fort Wayne, Indiana, 46805, with the V.F.W. Post # 2689 of Huntington performing Graveside Military Rites.

"Cowboy Fred" was born May 1, 1948 in South Bend, Indiana, the son of Joseph C. and Jane (Hickey) Kintz. He graduated in 1966 from South Bend Central High School and earned his Bachelors' Degree of Fine Arts from Indiana University of Fort Wayne. "Cowboy Fred" served and was decorated with a bronze star in the United States Army during the Vietnam conflict.

He was a member of St. Mary Catholic Church, the V.F.W. Post # 2689 and

the American Legion Post # 7 all of Huntington.

Survivors include his parents - Joseph and Jane Kintz of Phoenix, Arizona; a daughter - Gwendolyn (Brian) Niec of Cicero; a son - Jonathan A.
