October 2, 1935 - January 1, 2011

Goodrich T. "Goody" Lynch Jr., age 75, of Huntington, died at 6:20 p.m. Saturday (January 1, 2011) at the Peabody Retirement Community in North Manchester, IN.

Goody was born October 2, 1935, the son of Goodrich T. Sr. and Mae (Galloway) Lynch in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania. He was a 1955 graduate of Ridley Township High School in Folsom, Pennsylvania.

Goody worked at Wal-Mart for 11 years. Prior to that he worked 7 years as a store manager for Kmart in Pennsylvania, New York, and Massachusetts and then another 16 years at the Corporate K-Mart as a buyer.

Survivors include three sons – David A. (Michelle) Lynch of Huntington, Neil E. Lynch of Fort Wayne and Michael V. (Olivia) Lynch of Los Angeles, California, and seven grandchildren. His parents, and brother – Edward Lesley Lynch, precede him in death.
