Harold Lee Schoeff, 95, of Fort Wayne, passed away at 2:40 am Friday, July 18, 2025 at Heritage Pointe of Huntington.

Harold was born on November 27, 1929 in Huntington, IN, the son of Russell Schoeff and Ruth (Crosser) Schoeff. He graduated from Huntington Township High School with the Class of 1947 and married Joretta Lind on May 27, 1951 in Huntington, IN. She preceded him in death on March 2, 2010.
