Helen L. Cramer, age 103, of Marion, passed away at 10:25 p.m. Thursday (June 18, 2015) at Wesleyan Health and Rehabilitation Center in Marion.

Visitation will be from 3-7 p.m. Monday (June 22, 2015) at Needham-Storey-Wampner North Chapel, 1341 N. Baldwin Avenue, Marion, Indiana. Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday at Needham-Story-Wampner North Chapel with Rev. Richard Gongwer officiating. Burial will be in Gardens of Memory in Huntington County.
