



## Lewis "Bud" A. Smith

Lewis "Bud" A. Smith, 93, of Huntington, passed away at 1:07 am Friday, July 25, 2025, at his residence.

Lewis was born on November 2, 1931, at home in Lafontaine, IN, the son of Lewis Smith and Agnes (Critchlow) Smith. He graduated from Banquo High School and Valparasio Technical Institute.
