



Lowell R. Stouder

April 10, 1939 - June 20, 2014

Lowell R. Stouder, age 75, of Huntington, died at 8:37 p.m. Friday (June 20, 2014) at his home.

Visitation will be held from 2 p.m. - 8 p.m. Tuesday (June 24, 2014) at Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington. Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Wednesday (June 25, 2014) at College Park Church, 1945 College Avenue, Huntington, with Dr. Ray Seilhamer and Pastor Gary Dilley officiating. There will be one hour of visitation prior to the funeral service. Burial will be in Beech Grove Cemetery in Huntington County.

Preferred memorials are to Gideons Huntington Camp or College Park Church, in care of Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington, IN.

Lowell was born April 10, 1939 in Huntington County, the son of Howard O. and Georgia (Smith) Stouder. He graduated from Clear Creek High School in 1957. He earned his degree in Business from Huntington College in 1961, where he also studied Physical Education and Psychology. He was inducted into the Huntington University Hall of Fame in 2005 as an outstanding athlete in both basketball and baseball. After college, Lowell served in the United States Marine Corps. He married Phylis I. Pasko on April 11, 1964 at Union Church in Huntington County. He farmed all his life on the family dairy farm in Clear Creek Township. He also worked for Bailey-Love Mortuary. He was a

member of College Park United Brethren Church in Huntington, where he served as an usher, Sunday School teacher, and on the Board of Trustees. Lowell was Past President of Bippus Lions Club, and he served on the 4-H Fair Board. He served on the Huntington County Soil and Water Conservation Board and he was on the Board of Directors for the Huntington County Co-op. He was a member of Gideons Huntington Camp. He was an avid Chicago Cubs fan and a strong supporter of Huntington University Foresters athletics.

Lowell is survived by his wife of 50 years, Phylis I. Stouder of Huntington; one daughter - Jayne D. (Todd) Perkins of Wolcottville; one brother - Donald H. (Leanna) Stouder of Columbia City; and three grandsons - Matthew Perkins, Mitchell Perkins, and Michael Perkins, all of Wolcottville. He is preceded in death by his parents and one brother - Gary Stouder.
