Lucile Thompson, age 87, of Huntington, died at 2:00 p.m. Sunday (September 27, 2009) at the Heritage Pointe, Warren.

Lucile was born on December 25, 1921, in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, the daughter of Otto and Elenora (Buuck) Scheumann. She graduated from the South Side High School, Ft. Wayne, in 1940. Lucile then married Paul Thompson on February 16, 1946, at the Zion Lutheran Church in Ft. Wayne and has been a resident of Huntington since 1946. She worked at the Triad-Utrad for 15 years. Her hobbies included knitting, sewing, quilting, working in stained glass, making jewelry, and crewing on a hot air balloon. She was a fan of Huntington North girls and boys basketball.

Survivors include her husband of 63 years – Paul Thompson of Huntington; one son – Doug (Nancy) Thompson of Marion, Indiana; one daughter – Barbara (Jeff) Reed of Huntington; three grandchildren – Amber Johnson, Brooke (Ryan) Heisler, Randie (A.J.) Bradley and eight great-grandchildren – Erika, Todd, Brandon, Gabrielle, Jacob, Brody, Christopher and Haylie. Her parents precede her in death.

Visitation will be 3 to 7 p.m. Wednesday (September 30, 2009), at Bailey-Love Mortuary. Funeral service will be held at 10 a.m. on Thursday, (October 1, 2009) at the Bailey-Love Mortuary, with Rev. Dr. Richard Lofgren officiating.
