M. Lowell Baer, of Huntington, Indiana, passed at 9:48 p.m. Sunday (February 22, 2015) at Lutheran Hospital in Fort Wayne.

Visitation will be 3 - 7 p.m. Friday (February 27, 2015) at Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington. Funeral services will be at 10 a.m. Saturday (February 28, 2015) at Bailey-Love Mortuary, with one hour of visitation prior to service. Pastor Randy Hensley will be officiating. where he retired. Lowell loved baseball and tolerated his wife's love of animals.

Survivors include his wife of 59 years - Jeanine Baer of Huntington; one sister - Marilyn (Don) Anderson of Elkhart, Indiana; and several nephews and nieces. His parents, daughter - Cathy Diane Baer, brother - Leonard Baer, and a sister - Miriam Shrock, precede him in death.
