Marvin Max Hall, 85, of Huntington, passed away at 8:01 pm Friday, April 19, 2024.

Marvin was born on November 20, 1938 in Dunkirk, IN, the son of Clifford Hall and Lucille (Stotemyer) Hall. He graduated from Chrysler High School in New Castle, IN with the class of 1956. He earned his Bachelor's Degree from Ball State University in 1960 and his Master's Degree 1965. Marvin married Phyllis J. Johnson on July 31, 1970 in Huntington, IN. She preceded him in death on March 16, 2023. Marvin retired in 2003 as the Band Director from Whitley County Community Schools. He taught music from 1960-2004 at Southern Wells Community School Corp, Huntington School Corp, North Manchester School Corp, and Whitley County School Corp. He was a member of College Park United Brethren Church, Amity Masonic Lodge #483, Scottish Rite Valley of Fort Wayne, and Mizpah Temple in Fort Wayne. Marvin was the Past Exalted Ruler of the Huntington Elks, member of the Retired Huntington Teachers Association, Indiana State Teachers Association, National Teachers Association, Whitley County Teachers Association, and Theta Chi Fraternity.

Survivors include his Three Step Daughters, Dianna L. Whitesell of Huntington, IN, Deborah (Bruce) Lemar of Huntington, IN, Carla Miller of Andrews, IN; Five Granddaughters, Sondra Fowler of Huntington, Dawn Williams of Huntington, Amy Pasko of Huntington, Monique Dennis of

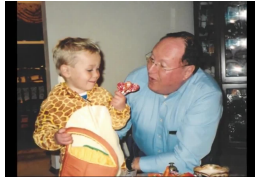

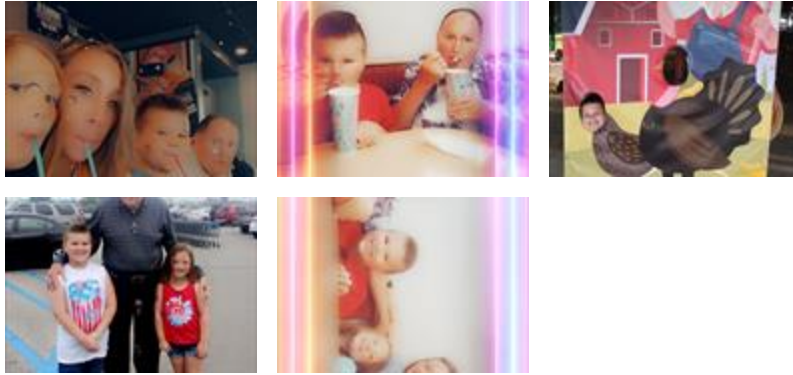
