Mary K. Hoch, age 84, of Huntington, died at 6:45 p.m. Friday (September 2, 2011), after a long illness. She was a resident of The Heritage of Huntington.

The former Mary Kathryn Saluke was born July 8, 1927, to William and Kathryn Smeltzley Saluke of Huntington. She was a 1945 graduate of Huntington Catholic High School. Her marriage was on June 12, 1948, to Max D. Hoch, son of Gilbert and Mildred Smith Hoch, also of Huntington. Her husband preceded her in death on June 13, 2007.

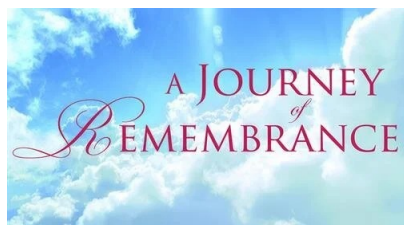
