Max E. Solloway, 86, of Huntington, passed away at 1:25 pm Saturday, December 19, 2020 at Millers Merry Manor, Huntington.

Max was born on September 22, 1934 in Huntington, the son of Edward S. Solloway and Gladys L. (Nowels) Solloway. He graduated from Huntington Township High School in 1952 and married Martha Huff on January 2, 1993 in Huntington, IN; preceded him in death on December 15, 2013. He was a proud Veteran of the United States Navy, working as a Navy Diver on Sub Rescue Vessels, and he worked as a Fireman in Huntington from 1966 to 1989, retiring after 23 years of service. After retirement he work for Emergency Management and was a part time Driver for HAT. In the early 70's, he started the Civil Defense Scuba Diving Team in Huntington County. He was a Lifetime Member of VFW Post 2689 in Huntington, and he was a Mason.
