Monroe "Rich" Miller, age 73, of Fort Wayne, formerly of Huntington, died at 10:40 a.m. Friday, March 22, 2019 at Sage Bluff Nursing and Rehabilitation in Fort Wayne.

A memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. Thursday, March 28, 2019 at Christ the King Episcopal Church, 1224 North Jefferson Street, Huntington, Indiana with Bishop Douglas Sparks and Father Ted Neidlinger officiating.

Rich was born on November 26, 1945 in Portland, Oregon, the son of Monroe Miller and Alismarie (McConnell) Miller. He was a 1964 graduate of Frederick Sasser High School in Maryland and earned a bachelor's degree from Ferris State College in 1969; he also graduated from Northern Indiana School of Theology. Rich was a high school teacher and assistant principal and was the Uniserve Director for the Indiana State Teachers Association. He formerly served as the priest in charge of Christ the King Episcopal Church in Huntington. He enjoyed baseball, softball, and visiting with friends.

He is survived by a son, Michael (Kristi) Miller, a daughter, Jennifer (John)

Johnson, and grandchildren Matthew Miller, Megan Miller, Josh Johnson, and Jane Johnson. His parents preceded him in death.
