Norman Everett Hartley, 92, of Huntington, passed away at 5:10 pm Sunday, December 29, 2024 at Ossian Health and Rehab Center, Ossian, IN.

Norman was born on March 5, 1932 in Roanoke, IN, the son of Wendall Hartley and Wanda (Crakes) Hartley. He graduated from Roanoke High School with the Class of 1950 and married Garnet Bernice Sands on November 26, 1955 in Huntington, IN She preceded him in death on May 5, 2009.
