



## Paul H. Neely

August 13, 1932 - April 16, 2020

Paul H. Neely, age 87, of Huntington, died at 9:20 a.m. Thursday, April 16, 2020 at his home.

Private family services will be held at St. Peter's First Community Church in Huntington to commemorate his life and achievements. A public memorial gathering will be held for family and friends at a later date to share their memories of Paul. The family wishes to extend their gratitude to the staff of Parkview Family Medicine of Huntington, Parkview Oncology, and Lutheran Radiation Oncology for their support and endeavors allowing Paul to live a much fuller life after diagnosed with cancer.

Paul was born on August 13, 1932 in Indianapolis, the son of Harry and Effie (Williams) Neely. He graduated from Indianapolis Arsenal Tech High School and served in the United States Army during the Korean War. After his enlistment, he earned a Bachelor of Art Education degree and a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Alabama. He was also attended John Herron Art Institute of Indianapolis, graduating with honors. Paul was married to Cynthia F. Miller, April 1956 in Indianapolis; she preceded him in death on May 8, 2012. After retiring from his career as a Hospital Administrator for Caylor Nickel Clinic and Winamac Community Hospital, he actively pursued his talent as an artist, particularly his passion for sketching and painting. He received many awards and accolades for his artwork, most

notably historical landmarks and bridges throughout Indiana, and managed to develop some prestige as a Hoosier artist. He was an avid angler and dedicated Colts and IU basketball fan.

Survivors include a son, David Neely of Mendon, Michigan, a daughter, Laura Snider of Huntington, and grandchildren Sarah LaRocque and family and Robert Snider and family.
