



## Ronald Charles Geyer

November 6, 1929 - May 11, 2019

Ronald Charles Geyer, age 89, of Huntington, died at 7:00 p.m. Saturday, May 11, 2019 at Tipton Place in Huntington.

Visitation will be from 9 – 10 a.m. Thursday, June 6, 2019 at St. Joseph Catholic Church, 641 North Main Street, Roanoke, Indiana. A memorial mass will immediately follow at 10 a.m. Thursday at St. Joseph Catholic Church with Father Dale Bauman officiating. Burial will be in Mt. Calvary Cemetery in Huntington with military graveside rites performed by VFW Post #2689 of Huntington.

Ron was born on November 6, 1929 in Huntington, the son of Kenneth M. and Wanda Marie (Christman) Geyer. He graduated from St. Mary's Catholic School in 1947 and served in the Indiana National Guard. He married Marilyn Joyce Biehl in 1954; she preceded him in death on April 6, 2011. He was the owner of the Plaza Marathon Gas Station since 1964; he retired in 1999. He was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Huntington. Ron loved music and sharing it with others.

Surviving in Huntington are sons Kirk M. Geyer and Todd M. Geyer, daughters

Rhonda L. (Kevin) Quickery and Janna K. (Rick) Mower, and a brother, Max A. (Lucy) Geyer. He is also survived by ten grandchildren and ten great grandchildren. Ron is preceded in death by his parents, his wife, a brother, David J. Geyer, a sister, Brenda L. Bauer, and grandsons Adam Mower and Benjamin Mower.
