



## Thomas A. Seifferlein

January 6, 1944 - December 14, 2024

Thomas A. Seifferlein, 80, of Bluffton, formerly of Huntington, passed away Saturday, December 14, 2024, at his residence.

Thomas was born on January 6, 1944, in New Orleans, LA, the son of Hilmer Seifferlein and Maxine (Parsons) Seifferlein. He graduated from South Bend Washington Clay High School and received his master's degree in education from Ball State University. He married Suzanne Thomas on July 26, 1968, in Huntington, IN. 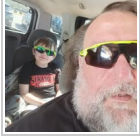
