



## Virginia L. Hacker

December 12, 1922 - July 23, 2015

Virginia L. Hacker, age 92, of Huntington, died at 10:48 a.m. Thursday (July 23, 2015) at Parkview Huntington Hospital.

Visitation will be from 3 p.m. - 7 p.m. Monday (July 27, 2015) at Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington, Indiana. Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday at Bailey-Love Mortuary with Rev. Raymond Scribner officiating. Burial will be in Gardens of Memory in Huntington County.

Virginia was born on December 12, 1922 in Wabash County, the daughter of Burl and Elizabeth (Binkerd) Haskett. She married G. She lived at Norwood Health and Rehabilitation from April 2011 - July 2015. She was a member of La Fontaine United Methodist Church in La Fontaine and attended Andrews United Methodist Church. She enjoyed quilting, gardening, and driving a tractor on the farm.

Survivors include two sons - John Wells (Joyce Ann) Hacker of Bluffton and James Glenn (Shelia) Hacker of Andrews; three grandsons - John Hacker Jr.,

Jeffrey (Cari) Hacker, and Jamie Hacker, and seven great grandchildren. She is preceded in death by her parents, her husband, a son - Joseph Theodore Hacker, and two brothers - Don Oliver Haskett and Charles Wayne Haskett.
