William R. "Bill" Marshall, age 67, of Huntington, died at 12:30 a.m. Saturday, January 19, 2019 at his home.

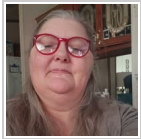

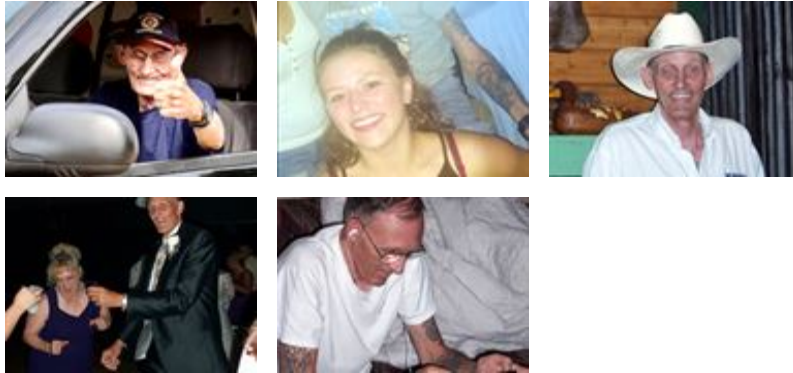
