William "Bill" Richey, age 62, passed away Tuesday morning, December 13, 2016 in his home. Bill was born June 3, 1954 to Janet and William Richey in Sandusky, Ohio. A life-long Buckeye at heart, Bill was an avid fan of all things Ohio, including his alma mater, Capital University. He graduated with a degree in Music Education, which he put to use as a choir teacher here in Huntington at Crestview Middle School. He taught for 37 years and treasured every co-worker and student that walked the halls with him.

Bill was also a dedicated musician in his personal life. He originally chose to play the trumpet, but later switched to tuba to impress a girl. That relationship didn't last, but his love for the tuba remained. He played in the Huntington Erie Band and the Huntington University Symphonic Wind Ensemble. He was a truly gifted singer and was a 40-year member of the Trinity English Lutheran Church Chancel Choir in Fort Wayne.

He is loved and remembered by his wife, Mary Michael Richey, and their two daughters, Elizabeth and Mary Ellen; his siblings, Terry (Mibelle) Richey, Bob (Gail) Richey, and Mary Jane (Joe) Jones; along with many other grieving relatives.

Visitation will be from 3 - 8 p.m. Tuesday, December 20, 2016 at Bailey-Love Mortuary, 35 West Park Drive, Huntington, Indiana. A memorial service will

take place Sunday, January 29, 2017 at Trinity English Lutheran Church. Pre-service music will begin at 3 p.m. with the service beginning at 3:30.

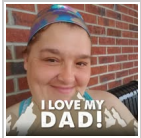

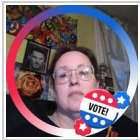

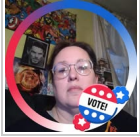
